# LET MY PEOPLE GO

God selected Moses.

Moses was humbled by God for 40 years and when he was 80, God appeared to him in a burning bush to call him to fulfill his purpose all along: to save God's chosen people.

*In the same way Moses did, can we trust God for injustice today?*

PASSOVER

The tenth and most severe plague is the angel of death. God's final judgment on the Egyptians was to kill the firstborns of each family including all of their animals. This was to finally prove that Pharaoh could simply not turn away and ignore God anymore. Pharaoh was going to be a part of accomplishing God's plan no matter what. While the judgment that the Egyptians received is truly awful, it was a just punishment for their sin and murder of the Israelite children. Even in the midst of all the suffering and death, God gives the Israelites the practices of Passover to save them from death that they deserve for their sins as well. God tells them to slaughter a spotless lamb, paint its blood on their door posts, and eat unleavened bread. Each of these is a picture of Jesus' sacrifice that saves from death. *How are a lamb, blood on doorposts and unleavened bread pictures of Jesus? Why did God use these plagues? What can we learn from this story?*
